IRCC will be implementing a 'recognized institution' framework by the fall 2024 semester. This framework will benefit the post-secondary DLIs by providing them with the option of priority processing of study permits for their prospective students and applicants.

Assessment of Post-Graduation Work Permit

IRCC will conduct a comprehensive assessment pertaining to the criteria for the Post-Graduation Work Permit Program. This assessment will commence shortly in the forthcoming months and new reforms will be introduced in order to meet the demands of the Canadian labour market. It will also meet the needs of the country's regional and Francophone immigration goals.
